Our goal is to ensure children have gifts during the holidays and that the families receive hygiene products and food staples to get through the holiday. The distribution was held on December 20, 2021 and for the health and safety of all involved, was

conducted as a drive-thru event. From the generosity of the community, our agency was able to provide presents for 210 children this holiday season. A total of 86 families went home with gifts, household essentials, and a box of shelf stable foods. The home essential bags donated by Procter & Gamble contained items such as: toilet paper, laundry soap, fabric softener sheets, toothpaste, and shaving cream. Families also received a food box donated by the West Ohio Food Bank.

Our agency is grateful to have been able to distribute the number of gifts we did. With families still being affected by COVID, the need for this service has grown and we were fortunate to have donors who made it possible. The committee began meeting in October to start planning for this event. Committee members made multiple shopping trips and worked hard to organize everything for the distribution. Members of the committee and staff volunteers are always excited to give their time to this program and the parents were very appreciative. 

The Home Energy Assistance Program (HEAP) helps Ohioans at or below 175% of the federal poverty guidelines pay their heating bills.

Ohioans who are threatened with disconnection, have been disconnected from their utility service, transferring services, establishing new services, at orbelow 25% fuel, or have been diagnosed with COVID-19 in the last 12 months, may also be eligible for the HEAP Winter Crisis Program, which started on November 1, 2021.

Ohioans can visit <u>energyhelp.ohio.gov</u> to apply online, download a copy of the application, or findcontact information for a local Energy Assistance Provider.

Individuals will need to have copies of the following documents to include with their application:

- Most recent utility bills
- A list of all household members (including birth dates and Social Security numbers)
- Proof of income for the past 30 days for all household members (12 months for certainincome types)
- Proof of U.S. citizenship or legal residency for all household members
- Proof of disability (if applicable)

HEAP benefits are applied to an individual's energy bill after January 1st. If you need immediate assistance with your energy bills, please contact your local Energy Assistance Provider.

A list ofproviders can be found at energyhelp.ohio.gov.

Applications for the HEAP Winter Crisis program must be received by March 31, 2022. The last day to apply for the regular HEAP benefit is May 31, 2022.
