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What is the expanded Child Tax Credit?

AUGUST 2022

To help families meet their children's basic needs, Congress expanded the Child Tax Credit (CTC) for 2021. Families will receive a total of \$3,600 per child up to age 5 and \$3,000 per child 6 to 17.

This will not affect your Medicaid, SNAP/Food Stamps, TANF Cash Assistance, SSI, or other public benefits.

Is My Child Eligible for the CTC?

To be eligible, children must:

- Have a Social Security Number.
- Live with you for at least half of the year.
- Be under age 18 as of December 31, 2021.

How do I get Signed Up?

If you haven't filed taxes recently and if your income is below under \$12,550 (under \$25,100 for a married couple) you can sign up at the link below!

You do not need to have any earnings to get this credit!



Healthy Fruit Roll-Ups - only need 1 ingredient!

- Applesauce
- Baking sheetsTwine
- Parchment Paper
 - Silpat (optional, but helpful)
- 1. Line baking sheet with silpat or parchment paper
- 2. Pour applesauce onto sheet and spread evenly
- 3. Bake at oven temperature of 170 degrees F or your oven's lowest setting for temperature for 6 to 8 hours for a drying time
- 4. Once the outer edges of the applesauce have hardened, your fruit roll-ups are ready
- 5. Remove the fruit leather from your silpat and transfer to parchment paper
- 6. Use sharp kitchen shears or a pizza cutter to cut the fruit into two-inch strips which will form the fruit

Roll the delicious fruit leather strips up and secure with twine rollup. You will want them to be long strips so you can roll them

Parent To Parent

Hello Head Start Parents,

This month we will be discussing the wonderful option of Home Based Early Head Start/Head Start. My oldest son (now 10) became a student in the classroom of LEADS Head Start in 2014. In May 2018, my middle child (now 7) started with WOCAP Head Start, at a classroom in Allen East. In August of 2018, we decided to switch to Home Based, and my son became a student of Ms. Katrina. Thanks to such a wonderful teacher and the comfortability of getting to participate in my children's education, our journey with Home Base took off.

Ms. Katrina helped me learn about Early Head Start Home Base for my infant daughter (now 3). There is this true sense of ease with every one of the Home Based teachers. They all make you feel included. During family days each teacher has so much knowledge to give that the feeling of being "new" to a community doesn't last long.

With Home Base you get the same education as you would in a classroom, but the comfort of being involved with your child's learning process IN YOUR HOME. Part of the benefits of being in the Home Based program is that the teachers come each week to help you work with your child at the individual child's level. Meaning they are capable of adjusting their work in P.A.T (Parents as Teachers curriculum) for your specific child's educational needs. They strive to meet you and your child where the child is educationally and building with them throughout the school years.

Another important aspect I would like to highlight is that the Early Head Start Home Based program goes year-round, with respect to Holiday times. Along with the fact that even though this is an in-home opportunity, Home Based holds days titled Family Days. Family days happen twice a month (usually on Fridays) and are intended to provide the socialization for the kiddos and parents alike. The teachers work hard to have members of the community come in and speak a bit about resources, as well as giving the parents the ability to bring up information they think others would enjoy.
