- popsicle sticks


Directions:

As spring is quickly approaching, and your kids are ready for burning off their energy, have you tried to figure out things for them to do outdoors? Here is a list of fun, cost-effective activities:

1.Use cardboard. Cut out a "window" and let your child find different shapes or types of clouds. Include information on the bottom or back of the "window" of the different types of clouds. Or create a checklist of cloud shapes or colors.

2.Spring doesn't always offer sun, every day. If it's not storming, try to allow your child five minutes in the muddy puddles with no shoes. It offers a chance of grounding and reconnecting with the Earth.

3.Utilize empty toilet paper rolls. Use rubber bands or glue to hold them together. They become binoculars the child can then decorate and use for finding different animals or finding the blooms.
