#### **HEAP Winter Crisis Program**

The Home Energy Assistance Winter Crisis Program (HEAP Winter Crisis Program) helps income eligible Ohioans that are threatened with disconnection, have been disconnected or have less than a 25% supply of bulk fuel in their tank maintain their utility service. The program can also assist with fuel tank replacement, fuel tank testing and heating system repair.

The program begins November 1, 2023 and runs through March 31, 2024

#### Pancake Mini Muffins

#### Ingredients:

- 1 c. all-purpose flour
- 1 tsp. baking powder
- 1 T. cane sugar
- 1 c. whole milk
- 3 T. butter, melted
- 1 egg
- 1 t. vanilla extract
- 1/4 t. salt

#### **Directions:**

- Whisk together flour, baking powder, and salt
- In a separate bowl, mix together the cane sugar, milk melted butter, egg, and vanilla extract
- Add the dry ingredients to the wet until just combined, using rubber spatula
- · Grease a mini muffin tin with cooking spray; fill with batter
- Fill with batter (it will make all 24 mini muffins)
- Top with mix-ins of choice or leave plain. I did around 2-3 blueberries, 2-3 strawberry chunks, and around 1 tsp of mini chocolate chips for the different flavors
- Bake the pancake mini muffins at 400 degrees for 10-12 minutes
- Remove onto a wire cooling rack
- · Serve with maple syrup, for dipping

The Crayons Go Back To School


