## TOTAL SOLAR ECLIPSE APRIL 8, 2024



The Allen County Sheriff's Office is spreading awareness that Allen County is expected to have a mass of influx of visitors for the April 8th total solar eclipse. The best thing that residents can do is to prepare now and plan ahead.

#### TRAFFIC WILL INCREASE

Expect significant traffic delays. Reschedule appointments that can be rescheduled. Be sure to have a full tank of fuel. If you do not have to travel or commute, consider staying home. If you must travel- have water and snacks with you. Let your family know that you may be hours late returning home that evening.

#### CELLULAR SERVICE WILL LIKELY BE INTERRUPTED

With the expected increase in our population, cell service is likely to be interrupted from as early as April 7th into April 9th. Plan on cell phone calls, texts, hotspots, and some credit card readers not working properly, if at all. WiFi routers are not expected to be interrupted, but could be. Have a communication plan in place with your family and children. Calls and texts to 911 will have top priority from cell providers.

#### **ESSENTIAL ITEMS**

Plan ahead for a delay in supplies by stocking up with a week's worth of essentials. Don't wait to purchase items such as groceries, toiletries, fuel, medications, and pet supplies. Have some cash for any unforeseen purchases or emergencies, as credit card readers may experience interruptions.

#### OTHER ITEMS TO PLAN FOR

Be sure your pets are secure. The influx of traffic increases the chance of your pet getting struck. Check on your neighbors, especially if cell service is lost. Plan to view the eclipse safely. Use proper eye protection such as solar viewing glasses that comply with the ISO 12312-2 international standard.




#### I Can Eat A Rainbow

Now - March 31, 2024 To Schedule An Appointment, Call 419-516-0063

Helps Income-Eligible Ohioans that are threatened with a disconnection, have been disconnected, need to establish new service, need to pay to transfer service, have PIPP default, need to pay first PIPP, or have 25% (or less) supply of bulk fuel in their tank maintain their utility service

#### Who Is Eligible?

- Households at or below 175% of the Federal Poverty Guidelines
- Facing disconnection
- · Have been disconnected
- Have less than a 25% supply of bulk fuel in their tank

#### **Required Documents?**

- Income for primary applicant and all the household members 18 years of age or older
- Social Security numbers for primary applicant & all household members
- Most recent utility bills
- Proof of citizenship for all household members
