


The Wide-Mouthed Frog

Let's talk about grief. We all learn to deal with it, but sometimes we forget there is no wrong way to grieve. I would like to remind you no matter how you grieve, or how long it takes, it is right for you. I found it to be an important topic to discuss this month.

Grief is defined as "deep sorrow, especially that caused by someone's death". I've learned that it doesn't subject itself to just the loss of a human someone, but also the loss of our pets. What I have also learned with this is that some people can grieve for only a little time, and others grieve for weeks, months or years to come. Neither is wrong.

Sometimes it can be that everything is absolutely fine one moment, and out of nowhere the tears start running. It can be just going through the motions of everyday life. It can also be the incapability of getting out of bed. While this is not a wrong way to grieve, it is important to seek help if the grief takes over you too much, for too long.
