## ST. MATTHEWS HEAD START The Importance of Structure & Play

It is important to have both structure and play in our Head Start Classrooms. We develop a daily schedule that becomes routine to the children and provides consistency and predictability. Of course, the children's favorite part of the daily schedule is Free Play. During Free Play, the teachers select toys that align with the Head Start Program Standards. The children are given the opportunity to play in a learning center of their choice and this is where the magic happens! Children learn best through play, taking away both academic lessons and social skills. For example, children working together to build a castle out of blocks are learning shapes, geometric thinking and spatial reasoning, they are engaging in cooperative play, showing creativity and imagination, problem solving, eye-hand coordination, conversations and vocabulary, persistence and so much more.

The block area is just one example. Learning centers are set up for language and literacy, mathematics, art, science, dramatic play, and fine motor daily. The children are free to explore each area and move about freely to follow their interests. The teachers engage the children to expand on the learning opportunities. We definitely have fun interacting with the children during this time! We are able to learn so much more about our students when they are playing and chatting freely. This also helps us develop strong bonds with each child and increases their feelings of comfort and safety in the classroom. Most importantly, it helps the children to realize that

learning is fun!







As teachers, we remind all of our families that daily structure at home is important and to remember that tablets have a place in learning, but remember that playing with toys and time outside has an important place in the daily lives of all children.



### Winter Crisis Program

November 1 - March 31

The Home Energy Assistance Winter Crisis Program (HEAP Winter Crisis Program) helps income eligible Ohioans that are threatened with disconnection, have been disconnected or have less than a 25% supply of bulk fuel in their tank maintain their utility service. The program can also assist with fuel tank replacement, fuel tank testing and heating system repair.

#### **Eligible Participants**

- Household income at or below 175% of the federal poverty guidelines
- Facing disconnection
- Have been disconnected
- Have less than a 25% supply of bulk fuel in their tank

#### **Required Documentation**

- Income for primary applicant & all household members 18 years of age or older
- Social Security Numbers for primary applicant & all household members
- Most recent utility bills
- Proof of citizenship for all household members

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## FREE PROGRAM THAT OFFERS SOCIAL, EMOTIONAL AND INTELLECTUAL GROWTH TO PREPARE CHILDREN FOR SUCCESS IN LIFE

Head Start is a comprehensive program for children and their families. We offer Home-Based and Center-Based options to best meet your needs. The Home-Based option consist of a home based teacher, child, and family work together to provide activities and experiences designed to meet the child's needs in the home environment for 1.5 hours.

Developmental screenings, hearing, vision, dental exam and treatment, lead testing, hemoglobin testing, parenting classes, WHAT SERVICES and various training opportunities. Transportation to the center may be provided for eligible children and each child **ARE PROVIDED?** receives a free snack, breakfast and/or hot lunch daily. Field trips and family days are scheduled throughout the year. Families income must be at or below 100% of the Federal WHAT ARE THE Poverty Guidelines. **REQUIREMENTS?** Families/children experiencing homelessness or who are in foster care are also eligible. Children with a disability may also qualify. Services available for children age birth – five years of age Service are available to families/children that live or work in
