How is West Ohio CAP Helping?

We have 4 areas of focus to combat lead risk

- 1. Education to the public/prevention precautions
- 2. Workforce Development
- 3. Outreach to the community
- 4. Abatement of lead in homes

WOCAP Lead Abatement

Through our Lead Safe Lima Program, we are hosting Lead Abatement Contractor Classes to connect contractors with mentors who can help navigate them in becoming Lead Certified. From these classes, we aim to hire local contractors to complete the lead abatement work to remove lead hazards from homes in our ocmmunity.

Lead Abatement Contractor Class

This training course uses both the EPA model Lead Abatement Contractor curriculum, HUD Guidelines, and includes OSHA and EPA compliance requirements. The class focuses on identification of safe work practices and job specifications for controlling hazards of lead paint, dust, and soil.

West Ohio CAP can help make repairs to your home to make it leadsafe for your family. Lead is a serious health risk because it is a toxic metal that can cause significant harm to people, especially young children, pregnant women, and those with prolonged exposure. Lead is known to cause a range of health effects, from behavioral problems and learning disabilities, to seizures and death. Children under 6 years of age are most at risk of exposure to lead-based paint because they crawl on the floor, and put their hands and other items that have leadbased paint dust on them into their mouths. Since their bodies are still growing, children tend to absorb more lead than adults. Understanding and preventing lead exposure is essential to protecting public health, especially for young children and vulnerable populations.



Where Can Lead Be Found?

- 1. Paints prior to 1978
- 2. Industrial paints & painting equipment
- 3.Batteries
- 4. Plumbing
- 5.Soil & Water
- 6.Imported food, medicines and cosmetics

What To Look For In Your Home:

- Age of your home, built pre-1978
- Deteriorating paint
- Paint that is peeling, chipping, cracking or chalking could be a sign of lead paint
- Dust

How To Qualify For The Program?

- Home built before 1978
- Live in the City of Lima
- Owner occupied OR Rental properties
- Have a child under the age of 6 living or visiting at least 20 hours/week
- Income Eligible
 - For Homeowners 80% Area Median Income
 - For Renters 50% Area Median Income

A huge THANK YOU to everyone who attended, volunteered, and helped make this event so special. Your support and participation create lasting memories for our students and their families.



The Home Energy Assistance Winter Crisis Program (HEAP Winter Crisis Program) helps income eligible Ohioans that are threatened with disconnection, have been disconnected or have less than a 25% supply of bulk fuel in their tank maintain their utility service. Parents are involved in decision making and in carrying out the program's activities. Parents serve on Parent Policy Council, parenting groups, and work as volunteers in the classroom. They also help to develop educational and social activities for their children.

FREE program that offers social, emotional and intellectual growth to prepare children for success in life

Head Start is a comprehensive program for children and their families. We offer Home-Based and Center-Based options to best meet your needs. The Home-Based option consist of a home based teacher, child, and family work together to provide activities and experiences designed to meet the child's needs in the home environment for 1.5 hours.

What Services Are Provided?

Developmental screenings, hearing, vision, dental exam and treatment, lead testing, hemoglobin testing, parenting classes, and various training opportunities. Transportation to the center may be provided for eligible children and each child receives a free snack, breakfast and/or hot lunch daily. Field trips and family days are scheduled throughout the uear.

What Are The Requirements?

- Families income must be at or below 100% of the Federal Poverty Guidelines.
- Families/children experiencing homelessness or who are in foster care are also eligible.
- Children with a disability may also qualify.
- Services available for children age birth five years of age Service are available to families/children that live or work in Allen • County
