than 20,000 Ohio working parents. Here at WOCAP, Head Start serves hundreds of children and families each year. Bridging the Distance: Connecting Incarcerated Parents with Their Children Through Books

As part of our continued efforts to support families impacted by incarceration, we're excited to introduce a new initiative designed to help MVP participants stay connected with their children–through the power of books.

Recognizing that many of our MVP participants have been separated from their children for

extended periods, this project offers a simple yet meaningful way to foster connection and emotional bonding. The idea is to provide incarcerated parents with books or booklets that they can personalize and send to their children. Each parent will have the opportunity to inscribe a message, begin an activity, puzzle, or drawing within the book, and then have it mailed to their child to complete. This shared experience creates a tangible and interactive connection that transcends the physical separation, allowing parents and children to engage in a common, heartfelt activity.

Thanks to Laural Kirchner, Coordinator of Education and Outreach at WBGU/PBS, who generously delivered the materials, we now have the tools to begin this project. In the coming weeks, we will be finalizing the logistics to bring this initiative to life. Though simple in concept, we believe this effort has the potential to make a lasting impact on the relationships between parents and their children.

In a touching tribute to a remarkable leader, two of our classrooms at the Early Learning Center have been named in honor of our late CEO, Jackie Fox, whose passion and dedication helped shape the foundation of our agency and the futures of countless children and families. Jackie served as CEO of WOCAP with unwavering commitment, vision, and heart. Her leadership not only strengthened our programs but also left an indelible mark on the lives of staff, families, and the community she so deeply cared for.

Following her passing, our team felt it was only fitting to create a space that would reflect her spirit and lifelong dedication to early childhood education. The two classrooms now bear her name and serve as living testaments to the values she championed: compassion, opportunity, and the belief that every child deserves a strong start.

These classrooms are more than just a tribute—they are vibrant, joyful places where learning, laughter, and growth happen every day. Each child who walks through the doors is a part of her legacy, continuing the work she held so close to her heart.

We are proud to carry her memory forward and are deeply grateful for the lasting impact she made on our agency and the entire community. Her legacy lives on in every story read, every lesson learned, and every child who feels seen, heard, and loved in our classrooms.

TICKET TO WORK

» NEXTSTEP SERVICES TIMELINE

- Meet with Ticket Specialist to determine eligibility if you are a good fit
- Complete an Individual Work Plan and assign ticket
- Begin the job search and review work skills needed
- Begin interviewing at businesses and accept a job!
- Check in monthly with your Ticket Specialist and let them know if any issues arise

> WHAT SERVICES DOES NEXTSTEP PROVIDE?

Help people navigate determining what type of job best suits their desires & needs. They can assist with updating resumes, applying for jobs, job tours, interview skills, on the job training, and benefits counseling

At NEXTSTEP there is not a timeline. They will remain a resource and support for years to come after building a 100% customized plan according to needs and desires

Parents are involved in decision making and in carrying out the program's activities. Parents serve on Parent Policy Council, parenting groups, and work as volunteers in the classroom. They also help to develop educational and social activities for their children.

FREE program that offers social, emotional and intellectual growth to prepare children for success in life

Head Start is a comprehensive program for children and their families. We offer Home-Based and Center-Based options to best meet your needs. The Home-Based option consist of a home based teacher, child, and family work together to provide activities and experiences designed to meet the child's needs in the home environment for 1.5 hours.

What Services Are Provided?

Developmental screenings, hearing, vision, dental exam and treatment, lead testing, hemoglobin testing, parenting classes, and various training opportunities. Transportation to the center may be provided for eligible children and each child receives a free snack, breakfast and/or hot lunch daily. Field trips and family days are scheduled throughout the uear.

What Are The Requirements?

- Families income must be at or below 100% of the Federal Poverty Guidelines.
- Families/children experiencing homelessness or who are in foster care are also eligible.
- Children with a disability may also qualify.
- Services available for children age birth five years of age Service are available to families/children that live or work in Allen
